

US LUO: Visa Issues

- Living and working abroad can be a Challenge
- Especially for non-US citizens in the US LHC community who work abroad for significant periods; even if they are US residents
- ☐ Return visas can be long-delayed, and hard to obtain
 - The delays can depend on geopolitical events, and the level of scrutiny being applied by the US DHS
 - ☐ If delays do occur, it is hard to get feedback
 - □ There is evidence that the rate of incidence is on the rise lately
- What can you do if your visa case has been delayed > 21 days ?
- □ Contact the National Academies' International Visitors Office
 - □ Before you Email them (<u>visas@nas.edu</u>) visit their website at <u>www.nationacademies.org/visas</u> and fill out the Questionnaire
 - NAS staff review the questionnaires each week and report the visa applications pending for > 21 days to the State Dept.
 - The State Dept. reports back to the NAS which cases are resolved each week.
 - The process continues weekly, until each case is resolved

The IVO questionnaire collects information regarding visa-related issues from the scientific community. Data will be used for the purpose of tracking trends and to assist visa applicants whenever possible.

US LUO: Visa Issues

- □ The process above is systematic and will generally yield results
 - ☐ It may still take a few more weeks
- What can be done in difficult cases?
 - □ Direct contacts with the State Department: work through knowledgeable people with contacts; such as Amy Flatten
 - ☐ This is for relatively rare cases
 - Write a letter to the US Ambassador of the country where the US LUO member is a citizen
 - ☐ Your university might be able to help, in some cases.
 - □ I am willing to help: to start the process, help make contacts, and if needed - write a letter
